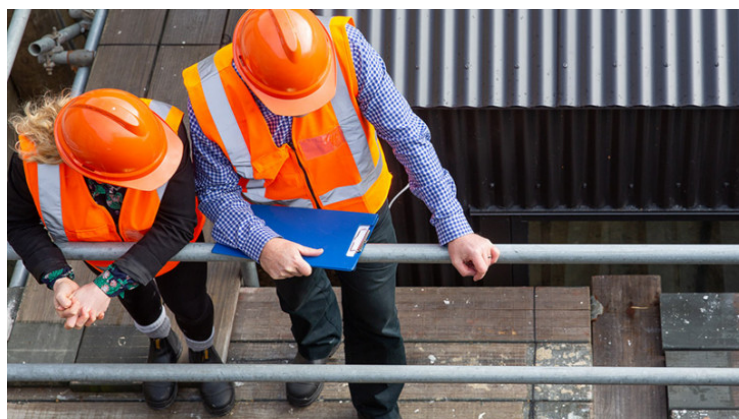


Biennial BCA accreditation reports

The Building (Accreditation of Building Consent Authorities) Regulations 2008 sets the criteria and standards that an applicant must meet to be accredited as a Building Consent Authority (BCA).

The accreditation assessments are undertaken by International Accreditation New Zealand (IANZ). The biennial accreditation reports summarise the results from the assessments and are written to provide BCAs with:

- A detailed overview of assessments undertaken in a particular round;
- A summary of key findings and trends from these assessments;
- An overview of feedback from MBIE's post-accreditation BCA survey.



Biennial BCA Accreditation Report, July 2017 - June 2019

This report summarises the results from round 6 of Building Consent Authority (BCA) accreditation assessments undertaken by International Accreditation New Zealand (IANZ), which were carried out between 1 July 2017 and 30 June 2019. It is the first round of assessments since the amended Building (Accreditation of Building Consent Authorities) Regulations 2008 (the Regulations) took effect on 1 July 2017.
